



Such work has proved to be inadequate and as some have argued just skimming the surface of a problem rather than addressing these concerns with greater depth. In order to move forward serious inquiry into curricula, content, the gendered construction of knowledge, as well as a more critical and proactive approach to issues of gender is necessary.As 'Gender' has to be recognized as a crosscutting issue and a critical marker of transformation in the minds of the students, this interactive learning resource turned out to be an excellent tool for proper understanding. However, to insist that without being an 'insider' to marginal experience, one has no right to represent it, is to fall into the same binary politics of exclusion. In reality, the power-relations among individual identity, gender, religion and creeds are so complex and diverse even within a 'marginal' community that they can challenge any established notion of the binary. Several works by Tarashankar Bandyopadhyay are remarkable for his representation of marginality.
